## 2016 BOARD OF SELECTMEN REPORT

First, we would like to thank all of our town employees, committee members, volunteers and residents for their participation and dedication in making our town a great place to live and work.

We commend our department heads for the diligence they have shown in keeping their budgets under control and within their bottom lines. However, due to years of tightly monitored budgeting, we did see some areas go over their projected bottom line for understandable reasons. There was enough flexibility in other lines to allow us to stay within our appropriation, and turn back \$157,044 to the general fund balance. The fund balance is very important to the Town and the Selectmen can use part of it to offset our town portion of the tax bill. This year we used \$200,000 to offset the town's tax rate and finished the year with \$864,155 left in the general fund balance. This year, our portion of the school costs increased, and the state support funding decreased resulting in a substantial increase in that portion of your tax bill.

The Expendable Trust for our town buildings has continued to be a very successful tool. This year we were able to complete the a few crucial repairs. Our elevator failed an inspection in the fall of 2016 and we were able to repair it and get it approved for use. The garage door at the former Meadowood station that is used by the police department broke and was replaced with a new door. These are the types of unanticipated things that can arise in town owned buildings.

Our next big project will be repairing the town hall upper steeple. We have solicited bids to repair and replace damaged areas of the steeple. We look for your support in funding the Town Building expendable trust to cover the cost of the repair. It is likely that the top section of the tower will be removed with a crane to allow for repairs to be done on ground level. It would then be securely reattached.

Our legal expenses were more modest than last year due in part to the fact that the Kinder Morgan TGP pipeline project was withdrawn in April of 2016. Our efforts locally and regionally through the Municipal Pipeline Coalition of towns proved to be beneficial in many ways, and strong connections with other towns was forged.

The prime wetlands study was successfully completed, and a series of presentations were made to explain the process and results by wetlands scientist Dr. Rick Van de Poll. The task force representing the Board of Selectmen, Planning Board and Conservation Commission met to review the findings and has made recommendations for nominations for six of the highest ranking wetland units in Fitzwilliam be brought to the voters in 2017 for approval as prime wetlands. All of the relevant information including maps and presentations are available on the town website ([fitzwilliam-nh.gov](http://fitzwilliam-nh.gov)). This is a multi-year project that has shown the importance and precious wetland areas in Fitzwilliam that are remarkable in their quality and for wildlife habitat. It has been a great collaborative project joining the Board of Selectmen, Conservation Commission and the Planning Board together to extend our understanding and appreciation of the exceptional natural resources that are contained in Fitzwilliam. We ask that you the voters support this important project that will enhance our town today and for future generations.

Thank you for allowing our board to serve the town.

## 2016 REPORT OF THE FITZWILLIAM HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

The Fitzwilliam Highway Department completed several projects in 2016. Paving Projects included applying another inch of asphalt on the section of West Lake Road which was reclaimed and paved last year as well as paving from the end of that section up over Noble's Hill to the last section of West Lake Road which was previously paved. Sandy Beach Road was paved after brush cutting, ditching, and many rocks were removed. Some of the bad sections of Templeton Turnpike and Collins Pond Road were also paved, as well as some sections of Royalston Road. The section of Richmond Road from Bull Run Bridge towards Town was also paved, completing that part of Richmond Road. Some roads that were in need of more work than just paving were ground up and graded. They included Cross Road, Old Turnpike Road, and Stateline Circle. These roads had some gravel added, brush and tree cutting, and will have more work done on them and then repaved in the future. The Transfer Station also had some paving done, the entrance and exist areas and some of the lower sections.

Another section of the gravel portion of Templeton Turnpike was worked on as well. Brush cutting, trees and limbs were cut, ditching and rock removal, after gravel was added, then compacted and graded. Other roads throughout Town had ditching and brush cutting done during the year, and gravel roads were graded. I might note that last summer was very dry and due to this dry condition, gravel roads did not get graded until we had enough moisture in them so they would not fall apart.

A couple of other small projects the Highway Department did this year were installing granite curbing at the Public Beach and installing drainage pipe and a catch basin by the Boat Landing. The curbing was installed to help with the erosion from heavy rains at the Beach. The drainage project by the Boat Landing increased the parking area there.

Paving Projects for 2017 will include East Lake Road from White's Grove Road to Howeville Road, Fullam Hill Road from Able Road to Longever Hill, Keene Avenue, and Cross Road. The 2017 Gravel Road Project will be Mathews Road. The Highway Department will also work on the Boat Ramp, adding more concrete logs to one side, continue working on Cold Storage Building lighting, and install new flagpoles at the Town Hall.

The Highway Department's equipment continues to operate in good working condition, though it is some of the oldest equipment the Town owns. This is largely due to the men I have working with me, Chris Rocheleau and Ryan Chamberlain. They both do an excellent job of maintaining the Town's Fleet. Thank you Guys!! The Highway Department tries to get the most life out of its equipment, but like all things, equipment must be replaced when it gets worn out, outdated, or unsafe. This year the Highway Department plans on replacing the 1993 chipper. The chipper has seen much use during its tenure with the Highway Department, especially during and after the 2008 ice storm. I hope you support this purchase.

Once again, I would like to thank my co-workers, the crew at the Town Hall, and all the residents of Fitzwilliam for helping make working for the Town of Fitzwilliam a pleasure.

## 2016 REPORT OF THE TRANSFER STATION

## **2016 REPORT OF THE FIREWARDS 2016 CALLS**

The Fitzwilliam Fire Department responded to 399 calls from the period January 1, 2016 to December 31, 2016. This is the second year in a row that the department has reached that number. This has been an increase of more than 90 calls over any prior period. Among the responses in 2016 were: nine (9) structure fires, twenty-nine (29) motor vehicle accidents, fifteen (15) brush fires/illegal burns and forty-three (43) mutual aid fire related responses to nearby communities including: Troy, Rindge, Jaffrey, Richmond, Keene, Marlborough, Swanzey and New Ipswich, as well as Winchendon and Royalston Massachusetts. There were twenty-one (21) automatic aid calls to the Town of Troy. There were ten (10) automatic fire alarms and CO alarms, seventeen (17) utility/wire related calls, four (4) car fires and five (5) other calls for service. The department also responded to one hundred fifty-seven (157) medical emergencies, and seventy-four (74) mutual aid medical calls to nearby communities including: Troy, Rindge, Richmond and Winchendon MA. There were also fourteen (14) public assist/lifeline calls.

The Fitzwilliam Fire Department received Mutual Aid sixty-three (63) times from surrounding towns for medical emergencies, motor vehicle collisions, structure fires and brush fires. The department also received automatic aid from Troy Fire at twenty-five (25) calls.

### **PERSONNEL, TRAINING, AND EDUCATION**

The department currently has twenty-five (25) active members. The department has nine (9) members who serve as fire personnel and two (2) as EMS personnel. Fourteen (14) members are both fire and EMS certified. There are seventeen (17) New Hampshire certified fire fighters. Seven (7) members have SCBA/PPE, six (6) members are certified at Level I, five (5) at Level II, three (3) at the Intro to FF III and two (2) at Level III. All personnel are certified with self-contained breathing apparatus and personal protective gear. Fifteen (15) members are trained at the Hazmat Operations level, five (5) at the Decontamination level and one (1) at the Technician level for Hazardous Materials Response.

There are fourteen (14) members who are certified at various levels of Emergency Medical Services. Three (3) are certified at the Emergency Medical Responder level, nine (9) are Nationally Registered EMT's and two (2) at the Advanced EMT level. One (1) member is currently awaiting results for Nationally Registered Paramedic. All active members on the department are required to maintain current CPR certification.

The department hired one (1) new member in 2016.

The Fitzwilliam, Royalston, MA, Richmond and Troy Fire Departments took part in quarterly training with FETC Training from Keene, NH. These sessions were for collaborative training among our neighboring communities that work within the mutual aid system.

Monthly trainings were held for both our fire and EMS personnel throughout the year. Members also took part in refresher training for EMS courses, required every two years. Members also participated in courses offered throughout the state that included Emergency Vehicle Driver Training, Incident Command, Large Animal Rescue, Ice Rescue and other Fire, Rescue and EMS courses.

### **VEHICLES**

The other inventory of vehicles includes the 2003 Pierce Contender pumper, the 2009 Mack tanker, 2009 Ford 350 Super Duty forestry truck, 1994 International Engine, and the 2013 Ford Ambulance. All the vehicles are in good working order at this time.

## **REPORT OF THE FIREWARDS - continued**

### **2017 BUDGET**

We have presented fire and ambulance budgets that we feel meet the needs of the town and the basic needs of the fire and EMS personnel. The Fire Department Budget is \$2,286.00 more than the budget approved at the 2016 Town Meeting. The increase is within salaries (with its corresponding taxes) and in the area of equipment maintenance and repair.

There is also a request in the capital budget to place \$20,000.00 in the expendable trust fund for a replacement class A pumper to be purchased in the future.

The ambulance operating budget for 2017 has an increase of \$6,900 over 2016 budget request. The increase is found in salaries and corresponding taxes, medical supplies and equipment purchases. As this report is prepared, the Budget Committee and the Board of Selectmen are reviewing our proposals.

### **FUTURE NEEDS**

The Fitzwilliam Fire Department, like most departments nationwide, is suffering in the decline of volunteer or call members. The department relies on Mutual Aid for many of our calls. In our area, we are very fortunate to have the Southwestern District Fire Mutual Aid System. Fitzwilliam was a charter member of this system, which was one of the first in the country. Under our mutual aid agreement, to receive mutual aid, a department must be able to provide it to other members. Many communities, due to understaffing, rely on mutual aid to meet their regular call volume.

Although we rely on the benefits of our mutual aid system, the Fitzwilliam Fire Department is always looking for new members to become firefighters and/or EMS personnel. The Fitzwilliam Fire Department is a paid on-call department, if you can make the call you are paid for the time on the call. Please consider joining the department. Applications can be found on-line on the Town of Fitzwilliam's website.

The Board of Firewards, officers and members of the fire department would like to thank the community for their continued support. Community members with questions about the fire department are encouraged to contact the Firewards and officers. The members are usually at the station on Wednesday evenings for meetings and trainings and for work details, anyone is encouraged to visit and learn more about fire and EMS services in town.

## 2016 REPORT OF THE RECREATION DEPARTMENT

In the winter, the Recreation Department offered the 2016 Fitzwilliam Youth Basketball Program. Jeff Joseph led as Basketball Coordinator. The program's participation was down from previous years (just under 40 registered kids), but the majority of kids were from younger grades and the future of the program looks promising. Practices and games were held weekly for 6 weeks. Overall, the program was deemed successful with the help of volunteer coaches and referees.

The portable ice rink was constructed back in December of 2015, but the weather that followed was not suitable to maintain proper conditions for skating. Unfortunately, the rink remained at the Pole Barn until proper thawing, but minimal usage was had this winter.

Yoga was offered with Sharon LaFlamme. Classes were held at the Fitzwilliam Town Hall on Thursday evenings from 6:30-7:30 p.m. with the exception of summer months.

Open Gym hours for Men's Basketball were available Monday evenings at Emerson School throughout the school year.

A 3-day Self Defense class was offered and instructed by Sean Cavanaugh.

Caregivers/Infants/Toddlers was introduced and received well by mothers/caregivers with their small children (newborn- age 3). The group meets together at the Fitzwilliam Town Library for an hour and a half of play, stories, and light crafts every other Friday.

Come Spring, the Recreation Department collaborated with the Police, Fire, and Highway Departments, plus NH Fish and Game to hold the Annual Children's Fishing Derby. The event was held at the Village Pond on Sunday, May 22<sup>nd</sup>. Prizes were awarded for various category winners and the Fire Department served lunch to everyone in attendance.

The 26<sup>th</sup> Annual Charlie Wallace 5K Memorial Road Race was held on June 25, 2016. A Children's Fun Run preceded the race. A lot of locals ran and the overall winner was fittingly, Perry Thomas (Charlie Wallace's grandson)!!

Kids look forward to the Summer Recreation Program each year. The 6-week program was exciting and exhausting! This year, we welcomed Lisa Sander as our Program Director. She and a terrific group of Leaders kept kids busy crafting, playing games, engaging in sports, and fishing. They hiked Gap Mountain, played mini golf, laser tag, and went roller skating. They swam at Spofford Lake and went to Skyzone and Canobie Lake Park too.

Soccer is always a huge hit! Over 100 kids participated in the program this fall. Joe Higgins was hired as Director. Games were held on Saturdays throughout September and October.

The Recreation Department and the Fitzwilliam Town Library collaborated for a 3<sup>rd</sup> time to host the Spooktacular Fall Fest on October 29<sup>th</sup>. Activities included crafts, decorating the Common with ghosts, and cider pressing and a kids' costume contest. The Library hired Simon Brooks to tell spooky stories for audiences of all ages.

The Recreation Department strives to offer affordable programming to the community. The Commission holds meetings the second Monday of each month (7:00 p.m. at the Fitzwilliam Town Hall). ## **2016 REPORT OF THE CEMETERY TRUSTEES**

### **Burials in 2016:**

There were 8 burials in the Fitzwilliam cemeteries in 2016. Six of the burials were cremation interments and two were full burials. The ratio of full burials to cremation interments continues to remain consistent with past years and also the national trend. We have full burial lots (which can also have cremation interments) and cremation only lots available for purchase in the Pine Grove Cemetery.

### **Work Force:**

2016 saw a major change in our work force. We operated without a Sexton and employed just two cemetery workers. The Trustees took on most of the Sexton's duties including the administrative work and overall supervision of the workers. One of the workers was designated as the lead person and handled the daily tasking and completion of work. This arrangement worked quite well this year and will continue again in 2017.

### **Recurring Work:**

Due to the dry summer, there was less mowing and grass trimming required for the cemeteries which provided opportunities for other grounds work and small projects. Our work crew of two individuals was able to keep up with the demands of the schedule. As in other past years, the Village Cemetery oak trees held their leaves until well into the month of November which always complicates the fall cleanup. Fall cleanup was not completely finished when the weather and temperatures made further cleanup impractical.

### **Equipment Issues:**

The Hustler zero turn mower completed its sixth full year of use in both cemeteries. We had to invest some time and money in routine repairs that removed it from service several times. All other power equipment is in good running condition and has been lubed and cleaned for the winter storage.

### **Trees and New Plantings:**

We removed a very large pine tree at Pine Grove Cemetery and one large tree at the Village Cemetery. Both presented a serious threat to people and the property in the cemeteries. The decision to remove trees is never taken lightly but time, disease and decay make some removals unavoidable. Tree trimming and removals have become a regular part of the cemetery management. We already know that some additional tree work, including at least one removal, will be required in 2017.

We did not plant any new trees this year but we hope to continue planting trees as funds allow.

Cemetery personnel trimmed and shaped plantings on the lots at both cemeteries as usual.

### **Grass and Leveling:**

We were able to level and reseed many low and sunken areas of the Village Cemetery this year. This has been an ongoing project and the work has improved the appearance and enabled easier mowing of the areas. We will continue with this work as time and funds allow. Pine Grove received applications of lime overall and fertilizer in some areas.

## **REPORT OF THE CEMETERY TRUSTEES – continued**

### Projects:

Sunken Markers – We were able to raise some of the sunken corner markers and flush stones in both cemeteries. More remain to be done and many of our stones continue to sink and would disappear from view if this work was not accomplished.

Granite Curbing – This work was begun in 2015 utilizing our heavy tripod and chain fall. Some curbing was leveled and straightened, but this is time-consuming and difficult work. We will accomplish some of this work each year as we have the time and manpower.

Although this work with the stones and curbing may not be obvious to people unless they are very familiar with the cemetery, the outcome will have a long term positive effect on the grounds and memorial stones.

### Document preservation:

Phase Three of the document preservation project was completed this year. All of the Village Cemetery deeds, indexes, burial records and maps have now been treated for paper stabilization and acid reduction, scanned to digital images and placed in mylar protective sleeves. The scanned images have been printed out and placed in binders for routine access and research. The originals have been placed in the town document vault for long term storage. At some time in the future, we will consider preserving some of the older Pine Grove records but that is not in our short term plans.

### Pine Grove Expansion:

We plan to utilize the expansion area behind the most recent lots and memorial area for additional full burial lots. This has been part of the long term plan and will provide forty additional lots. The area will be surveyed to establish the lot corners and granite quadrant markers will be installed. The costs of the survey and markers will be taken from the Pine Grove Expendable Trust which is funded by part of the lots sales fees. Note, these are not perpetual care funds that will be used.

### Village Cemetery Shed:

The Trustees were aware of serious deterioration of the Village Cemetery shed and solicited several estimates for repairs. As more inspection of the conditions was made, we realized that the sills, lower wall framing, door framing and the door itself were in far worse condition than expected. The rough estimates that were received reflected these problems and the estimates came close to the cost of a new shed without resolving all of the possible deterioration and structural issues.

We had a long range plan that would eventually provide for the construction of a new shed at the Pine Grove Cemetery. Since repairs of the Village shed would at least approach (if not exceed) the cost of a new shed, the Trustees have decided to request the funds to build a new shed at Pine Grove Cemetery that would be the primary maintenance and storage facility for both cemeteries. The existing shed at the Village Cemetery will be torn down without replacement.

## 2016 REPORT OF THE TOWN CLERK

2016 was a busy year for the Clerk's office. We processed 3,670 motor vehicle transactions, of that 310 were by E-Reg, registered 43 boats, licensed 683 dogs and hosted 4 elections.

Revenue collected in the office increased again in 2016 by \$12,782.06. Total revenue collected in the Clerk's office was \$429,959.95 (compared to \$417,177.89 in 2015), the majority of which was for motor vehicle registrations.

The Presidential Primary was held on February 9<sup>th</sup>. A total of 933 ballots were cast (455 Republican and 478 Democratic). Polls were open from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. The Town welcomed 69 new voters.

The Local/School election was held on March 8<sup>th</sup>. A total of 298 ballots were cast. Polls opened at 11 a.m. and were closed at 7:04 p.m. Town Meeting was opened at 7:14 p.m. and adjourned at 8:01 p.m. Fifteen articles were discussed and voted on.

The State Primary was held on September 13<sup>th</sup>. A total of 363 ballots were cast (200 Republican and 163 Democratic). Polls were open from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m.

The State General Election was held on November 8<sup>th</sup>. Turnout was higher than any other election held in 2016, however the Town saw a greater turnout in both the 2008 and 2012 General Elections. At the end of the day, 104 new voters were added to the checklist and 1,292 ballots had been cast (110 by absentee ballot). The Town voted mostly Republican except for Representative in Congress.

As always, we strive to meet the needs of our residents while complying with all laws related to motor vehicle, election, vital statistics and privacy. It is a pleasure to continue to serve the residents of Fitzwilliam.

## 2016 REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD

The first duty of the Planning Board is to prepare and amend a master plan to guide the development of the municipality. Planning Board regulatory duties include the review and approval of all subdivisions, boundary line adjustments, voluntary mergers and site plan review applications for commercial uses or multi-family residences. The Planning Board may recommend to the local legislative body amendments to the zoning ordinance.

On March 8, 2016 voters approved two ordinances recommended by the Planning Board, including a commercial and industrial noise ordinance aimed at protecting residents from exposure to excessive noises emitted from commercial and industrial development by regulating noise levels and sound quality. Voters also approved amending the mining ordinance to allow mining operations of a certain size to proceed with a conditional use permit in all districts of Town. This change ensures Planning Board authority to exercise local site plan review authority over these operations.

The Planning Board held an unprecedented eleven public hearings on the Eversource site plan review and conditional use permit applications; and to negotiate the construction of a sound wall on two sides of the substation. The sound wall was completed on October 14, 2016, and the final sound study was conducted on November 14, 2016, verifying sound levels were at the decibel level required by the Planning Board to protect abutters from future noise issues.

The Planning Board held four public hearings with Blue Sky Towers for site plan review and conditional use permit applications to locate a wireless communications tower outside of the wireless communication facility overlay district, following approval of a location variance by the Zoning Board of Adjustment.

During 2016, the Board conducted 18 preliminary consultations regarding proposed new commercial uses in Town, four public hearings on ordinance proposals, 3 public hearings on subdivision applications; four site plan reviews; three hearings for conditional use permits; 2 applications for boundary line adjustments, and meetings on Complete Streets Program and Traffic Safety issues regarding the intersection of NH Route 119 and NH Route 12.

In November and December the Planning Board held public meetings and public hearings on proposed amendments to the Wetlands Overlay District Ordinance to incorporate Prime Wetlands findings based on the Prime Wetlands Study authorized by Town Meeting in 2016 and conducted by Wetlands Scientist Rick Van de Poll

The Planning Board thanked Mac Landy for his expertise and 28 years of service on the Board, wishing him well as he moves to Illinois. The Board welcomed former Board member Carlotta Pini back as an Alternate, after resigning in 2015, having served 15 years.

The Planning Board values input from Town residents and welcomes you to attend meetings; and encourages interested volunteers to serve on the Board as members or alternates. The Planning Board meets on the first and third Tuesdays of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Town Hall.

## **2016 REPORT OF THE ZONING BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT**

The Zoning Board of Adjustment holds public hearings for every appeal for relief from zoning ordinance requirements. The Board considers the unique circumstances of each case and decides to grant relief, if warranted, based on specific criteria. They consider the impact of the proposed action on the neighborhood and the land, and whether it is in harmony with the purpose and intent of the zoning ordinance. The Board can't change zoning ordinances but is empowered to grant appeals in accordance with State Statute and local law as specified in the Land Use Code.

The Board considers appeals for Variances, Special Exceptions, Equitable Waivers of Dimensional Requirements, Appeals of Administrative Decisions and Motions for re-hearings.

During 2016 the Board of Adjustment met 14 times and deliberated on nine cases, three of which were continued several times. The Board took the following actions:

- Granted two Special Exceptions;
- Granted six Variances;
- Granted one Equitable Waiver of Dimensional Requirements; and
- Denied three applications.

The Zoning Board of Adjustment meets the second Tuesday of the month, when they have an application before them. The Board invites and encourages all interested parties to attend hearings and meetings as noticed. Abutters are notified for each appeal for a public hearing.

## **2016 REPORT OF THE HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION**

The mission of the Historic District Commission is to preserve historic structures and places of historic and architectural value; preserve a district in the municipality that reflects elements of its cultural, social, economic, political and architectural history; conserve property values; foster civic beauty; and maintain the existing architecture of the district. The Commission reviews all exterior construction/renovation located within the Historic District of Fitzwilliam through an application process and public meetings. They are also responsible for amendments to and adoption of regulations in accordance with State statutes.

In 2016, the Historic District Commissioners met five times and used the design guidelines to review eight applications including: exterior modifications and repairs for residences, roof and window replacements, new business signage, new fencing, and a new wireless communication tower. Commissioners met with a resident to discuss a Complete Streets Program. They also reviewed a proposal to repair the Town Hall Steeple.

Applications for all exterior changes within the Historic District come before the Commission for consideration and approval. The Commission meets on the second Thursday of each month at 4:00 p.m. in the Town Hall when there is a case before it. All meetings are open to the public and we encourage participation from all those interested.

Commissioners accepted with regret Helen Collins' resignation from the Commission, and thanked her for her service, wishing her well in her move to Tennessee. Commissioners welcomed Eileen McHugh back to the Commission after a long hiatus.

## 2016 REPORT OF THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Fitzwilliam Conservation Commission continues its mission to protect the natural resources of the town. We thank voters for approving last year's \$5,000 request for our Conservation Land Fund and appreciate your continued support.

We have been working over the past year with Selectmen and Wetlands Scientist Dr. Rick Van de Poll on the Prime Wetlands study, toward which voters approved \$15,000 on the 2015 Town Warrant. In March we made recommendations for Prime Wetlands designated areas from an extensive list of candidates identified in the study. We participated in a Prime Wetlands presentation in October, and public hearings before the Planning Board in December and January, recommending changes to the existing Wetlands Protection Overlay District ordinance and approving the final top six candidates nominated for Prime Wetlands status to be presented for a town vote.

We hope you will take the time to review the information provided on the Town's website about this important project so that you can make an informed decision in the voting booth on Tuesday, March 14th. This is a ballot item -There will be no opportunity to discuss it on the Town Meeting floor.

The Commission is wrapping up changes to the Katie Metzger Town Forest Management Plan, which we hope to begin implementing in the coming year. We are exploring opportunities to improve access to this attractive town resource as we also monitor, maintain, and encourage use of the Widow Gage Town Forest and its trails.

As part of the regional opposition to the presently withdrawn Kinder Morgan gas pipeline application, we attended many meetings, wrote letters, and had discussions on this issue. We thank the many whose efforts helped achieve the final outcome.

The Commission has initiated a project to protect wetlands near popular dog walking trails. After consulting with Selectmen over various locations, we obtained permission from the state and plan to install a trial dog waste cleanup station on the rail trail at Collins Pond Road/Templeton Turnpike this Spring. We encourage dog walkers to clean up after their dogs by using the bags and disposing of them in the container provided.

We have also been working with the Monadnock Conservancy toward the purchase of the Chamberlain property on the west side of Old Turnpike Road. This large wetland area offers significant recreational opportunities for the community. Drawing upon data from our Prime Wetlands study, the project has received two matching grants to supplement a \$6,000 contribution from our Conservation Fund.

Our Open Space Committee has completed its mission of contacting and educating landowners about conservation options for their property. We hope you will consider preserving open space by placing an easement on your land. Contact the Conservation Commission if you are interested in learning more about land conservation options.

The Commission continues to advise groups, applicants, and agencies on conservation matters and attend workshops and conferences. We recently welcomed Kevin Woolley as an alternate member and hope you will consider joining the Commission. Our meetings are held every third Monday at 7 p.m.

## 2016 REPORT OF THE CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICE

The Code Enforcement office enforces regulations of the Fitzwilliam Land Use Codes, issues permits for construction, and occupancy permits for new home occupation after completion of construction.

Upon receipt of a written complaint, the Code Enforcement Officer performs an investigation, ensures compliance of construction permits to applicable zoning requirements, dedicates Emergency 911 numbers; and reviews all construction permit applications and plans. This review ensures safety from fire, flood and establishes that all other public requirements are met. Once a permit has been granted, the Code Enforcement Officer visits the property prior to the start of construction to determine that all setback requirements have been adhered to.

If you should have any questions with regard to permitting for construction please contact the Land Use Office to obtain a copy of the Construction Permit regulations. Please remember that all construction, renovation, demolition and changes to buildings require a permit. We have seen an increase of construction being completed in town without first obtaining a construction permit approval. It is always best to check with our office prior to construction to determine if a permit is required. When applying for a permit, please remember to allow yourself enough time for the paperwork to be processed prior to the start date of construction.

In 2016, 65 construction permits were issued, with four issued for new single-family dwellings and two issued for demolition of existing dwellings and the rebuilding of new single-family dwellings. ## 2016 REPORT OF THE ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER

2016 was relatively a busy year for animal calls. There were 152 calls for assistance ranging from dog complaints to crowing roosters. There were also several calls for wild animals such as skunks, bats, foxes, woodchucks, raccoons and a bobcat.

This year there were calls for service for Moose and Deer vs. motor vehicle accidents as well as two dogs and three domestic cats killed by motor vehicles. There was one dog that was killed by a bobcat, according the Veterinarian. It is important to keep dogs either tied, on a leash or under voice control at all times for everyone's safety and it is the law.

Please remember that you should contact the Police Department for any animal complaints by calling 585-6565.

If you are missing or have found a dog or cat or have an animal problem, please call the Fitzwilliam Police Department and they will notify the Animal Control Officer. It is fine to put it on Facebook or other social media areas, but the sooner we are notified by direct contact the faster we can assist you. There are times that we may already have your animal in custody.

I have taken a large animal rescue class over the past year to be able to assist you, should you have issues with your large animals.


I would like to thank everyone in the community for their assistance and support this year.

## **2016 COMMUNITY VOLUNTEER TRANSPORTATION COMPANY**

CVTC has had quite a year! We expanded our service area from 13 to 33 towns in the Monadnock region following the transfer of the American Red Cross medical transportation program out of Keene.

CVTC gives the gift of HOPE with every mile we drive! Using 2016 data from January through September, our Volunteer Drivers have driven 60,640 total miles for 239 riders living in 26 of 33 towns. Currently, we have 71 active Volunteer Drivers and have a goal of 120 to cover the entire region.

Through our Volunteer Driver Program we:

- assist in sustaining and/or improving the health and wellness of riders and drivers;
- provide access to essential healthcare, support services, and other basic needs for those who are unable to drive or don't own a car because of age, ability, income level, and/or life circumstance; and
- enhance our riders' ability to reclaim, retain or attain independence by providing for themselves and their family.

### **SERVICE REPORT**

77 ride requests were received from 4 Fitzwilliam residents;  
1,642 miles logged in for volunteer drivers;  
152 hours of service donated for a value of \$2,280; and  
2 volunteer drivers live in Fitzwilliam.

Now entering our eighth year of service, CVTC is a stronger thread in the safety-net of human services and continues to advocate for community transportation options for the entire region.

## 2016 REPORT OF THE MONADNOCK ADVISORY COMMISSION

The Monadnock Advisory Commission was created by State Statute and is charged to advise and guide the Department of Resources and Economic Development on the management of lands on Monadnock, Gap, and Little Monadnock Mountains. State law allows the Commission to accept tax deductible donations. MAC is a primary source for search and rescue supplies and equipment.

Two meetings are held annually, usually at the Jaffrey Civic Center. The most recent meeting was held at Monadnock State Park Headquarters. Director of Parks, Phil Bryce led a tour through parking facilities and buildings. The focus of the follow-up discussion was on needed improvements. Comments and recommendations were sought from town representatives, as well as, the many Division of Parks and Forest Society representatives present.

The State Park Manager has reported on attendance for 2016. Total day use at Head-quarters, Gilson Pond and the Toll Road was 119,596, a slight decrease over 2015. This is likely due to poor weather on Saturday and Sunday of Labor Day and Columbus Day weekends. However, Headquarters was filled to capacity and went to turn-away on Monday of Columbus Day. The Toll Road parking area reached capacity most weekends throughout the season.

Monadnock State Park has obtained an EMS Unit Non-Transport License from the NH Department of Safety. This will allow the Park to provide a higher standard of care for visitors. Park Staff and Mountain Patrol Volunteers responded to 42 search and rescue calls, which included 8 litter carry-outs, 15 assisted walk-outs and one DHART fly-out off the mountain.

Two professional trail crews, the Jolly Rovers and Off the Beaten Path, were hired and funded through SPNHF Monadnock funds. Each crew worked hardening/constructing stone stairs on the White Dot and White Cross Trails over ten days.

On January 7<sup>th</sup> the Forest Society hosted a public tour to showcase timber harvest activities being conducted on the Society's Monadnock Forest Reservation in Jaffrey. The tour shared the forestry prescription and logging activity taking place on approximately 50 acres adjacent to the Marlboro Trail.

**ARTICLE 1.** To bring in your votes for the election of one Selectman for three years; one Moderator for two years; one Fireward for three years; two Budget Committee Members for three years; one Trustee of the Trust Funds for three years; Two Trustees of the Library for three years; one Cemetery Trustee for three years; two Planning Board members for three years; one Planning Board member for one year; one Commissioners of Plante Memorial Park for one year, one Commissioners of Plante Memorial Park for two years, one Commissioners of Plante Memorial Park for three years; one Supervisor of the Checklist for six years.

Compliance noise measurements will be the financial responsibility of the project owner and shall be independently performed by a qualified professional when directed by the Board of Selectmen or their agents, the Planning Board or the Zoning Board.

Baseline decibel levels are specified in the ordinance, as are maximum decibel levels for AM and PM commercial and industrial noise.
