Dedication

Katherine (Katie) H. Metzger

1923 – 2018

Fitzwilliam was saddened to learn of the passing of Katie Metzger on March 29, 2018. Katie and her husband Hayes came to Fitzwilliam in 1976, and Katie was heavily involved in town and state affairs throughout her many years in New Hampshire. She served on and chaired many town boards, including the planning board, conservation commission, and select board. She worked with the National Register of Historic Places, the Fitzwilliam Garden Club, the Fitzwilliam Community Church, The Monadnock Conservancy, and was one of the incorporators of the Cheshire Medical Center, and chairwoman of the executive committee of the Southwest Region Planning Commission. She helped lead the effort to raise substantial funds for renovation and expansion of the Fitzwilliam Town Library. At the state level, Katie served in the N.H. House of Representatives from 1988 to 1998, ending her career in the legislature as chairwoman of the Municipal and County Government Committee. She served on the board of the Statewide Program of Action to Conserve our Environment (SPACE), and as president of the New Hampshire Association of Conservation Commissions. The Katie Metzger Town Forest recognizes these many accomplishments and serves as a living memorial to Katie's impact on conservation in Fitzwilliam. We remember her fondly and are grateful for the opportunity to have known her.

2018 REPORT OF THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN

The Board of Selectmen would like to extend our appreciation and gratitude to all of the employees, elected officials and volunteers that have served the Town over the past year. It is because of these people the Town runs smoothly without disruption throughout the year.

The Board would also like to thank and acknowledge the hard work department heads have done to manage their budgets to keep spending at a minimum. We would also like to thank the Town Hall staff for their service to the community, welcoming Heidi Wood back to her normal hours and welcoming a new Land Use Assistant, Laurie Haywood, assisting with Planning Board, Zoning Board and Historical Commission and their work.

The Town Hall Steeple project is a work in progress and will be for the next couple of years. The pillars at the front of the Town Hall have been replaced and the foundation to the steps stabilized. We applied for two grants this year, The Moose Plate Grant which we were awarded \$10,000 and the L-Chip grant which we were awarded \$10,000 for engineering plans for the Steeple Project. Both grants will be used toward the repair and restoration of the Steeple. The Steeple project has taken on more than was originally proposed over the last couple of years. As we progressed through mapping out the project, the areas expanded to include not just the steeple but also the clock portion of the Town Hall. We are presently mapping the time frame and work to be done. Jay Southgate of Southgate Steeplejacks was hired for the project. Plans to stabilize the tower until next summer when it will be removed were designed and implemented. With the Town Hall being the center of our community and an important part of Fitzwilliam, we are trying to assure that we have everything taken care and that it will last another 200 years.

In July, the Board of Director's of Meadowood County Area Fire Training Center approached the Town to take over their property located in the area of 156 Bowkerville Road, including the assembly hall and pavilion to the rear of the assembly hall and the property on the pond side of Bowkerville Road to include the dam and miscellaneous smaller buildings, formerly used for Fire training for over 50 years. The Selectmen asked the Recreation Commission to spend some time and thought looking into the use of MCAFD property, not solely for use by the Recreation Department, but the Town. A Task Force was created to look at the future use of this property and to determine if it would be a feasible property for the town to acquire.

The Board of Selectmen would like to thank and acknowledge the hard work Debbie Favreau, the Town Administrator has done to improve benefits for Town employees in areas such as health insurance and offering new benefits to employees at no cost to the tax payers. Both Mrs. Favreau and Mrs. White, Secretary to the Board of Selectmen do a wonderful job in keeping on top of the day to day running of the Board of Selectmen's office.

The Board of Selectmen have worked with the Board of Firewards in efforts to strengthen the ambulance and emergency care programs as calls continue to increase. The Selectmen are recommending adding a new position for a part-time Fire Chief and per diem personnel during the week to ensure we have coverage for the Town's people.

2018 REPORT OF THE FITZWILLIAM HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

In 2018 the Highway Department completed the following road projects: stone sealing all of Fullam Hill Road and the rebuilding and paving of Warren Hill Road. A large culvert on Jaffrey Road was replaced and new guardrail installed. Some sections of Rhododendron Road and Templeton Turnpike were improved. Rocks were removed, ditch lines cleaned, and gravel added.

The Highway Department also performed the regular maintenance needed on our roads throughout the year, but the summer and fall proved challenging with all of the rain. This weather pattern seems to be continuing and our roads are showing it. The Highway Department will always try to keep our roads in good shape, but there are times when Mother Nature makes it hard, like this last fall and winter.

In 2019 the Highway Department is asking to replace the 2003 Ford F-550, which has served the Town for 15 years. Road Projects for 2019 will be determined after we have assessed the roads. Some roads, due to the winter, may need to be repaired sooner than other roads.

2018 REPORT OF THE TRANSFER STATION

Once again things continue to change at the Transfer Station as world markets for recyclables change. China, once the biggest market for our recycled materials is no longer accepting most of the materials. It is getting harder to move loads of recyclables, let alone get paid for them.

When I started working for the Town some 20 years ago, the Town received money for recycled glass. That ended over ten years ago, after that we trucked our glass to Keene where it was crushed into fill. At first it was twenty dollars a ton, then sixty, and now eighty dollars a ton that the Town pays to bring the glass to Keene. Adding in the cost of handling and trucking, the cost is nearly double and unfortunately the economics of it is not the best option for the Town at this time. With that said, we will continue to explore other options, as we do with all of our operations at the Transfer Station, but until then glass will go in the compactor as trash.

The problem with trash and recyclables is, we as a nation, just make too much. The only real solution is to make less, use less, and reuse what we can. I know many people have concerns on these issues and please feel free to call and talk with me anytime, maybe together there might be some better answers to these problems. It is after all YOUR Transfer Station and YOUR Town.

2018 REPORT OF THE FIREWARDS

2018 CALLS

The Fitzwilliam Fire Department responded to 407 calls from the period January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2018. The number of calls has remained fairly steady over the past 4 years, however, with the slight increase this year, 2018 marks the first time that the department has responded to more than 400 calls. Among the responses in 2018 were: four (4) structure fires, twenty-nine (29) motor vehicle accidents, two (2) chimney fires, four (4) brush fires/illegal burns and thirty-six (36) mutual aid fire related responses to nearby communities including, Troy, Rindge, Jaffrey, Richmond, Marlborough, Swanzey and New Ipswich, as well as Winchendon and Royalston, Massachusetts. In addition, there were sixteen (16) automatic aid calls to the Town of Troy. There were twenty (20) automatic fire alarms and CO alarms, twenty-four (24) utility/wire related calls, one (1) car fire and ten (10) other calls for service. With respect to EMS, the department also responded to one hundred forty-seven (147) medical emergencies, and one hundred seven (107) mutual aid medical calls to nearby communities including Troy, Rindge, Richmond and Jaffrey. Finally, there were also fifteen (15) public assist/lifeline calls.

The Fitzwilliam Fire Department received Mutual Aid twenty-nine (29) times from surrounding towns for medical emergencies, motor vehicle collisions, structure fires and brush fires. The department also received automatic aid from Troy Fire Department for twenty (20) calls.

PERSONNEL, TRAINING, AND EDUCATION

The department currently has twenty-one (21) active members, ten (10) of whom serve as fire personnel and one (1) as EMS. Ten (10) of the members are both EMS and fire certified. There are eighteen (18) New Hampshire certified fire fighters, three (3) members have SCBA/PPE, seven (7) members are certified at Level I, five (5) at Level II, two (2) at the Intro to FF III and one (1) at FF Level III. All personnel are certified with self-contained breathing apparatus and personal protective gear. Thirteen (13) members are trained at the Hazmat Operations level and four (4) at the Decontamination level for Hazardous Materials Response.

There are eleven (11) members who are certified at various levels of Emergency Medical Service. There are four (4) members certified at the Emergency Medical Responder level, three (3) are Nationally Registered EMT's, three (3) at the Advanced EMT level and one (1) at the Paramedic level. All active members on the department are required to maintain current CPR certification.

The department hired six (6) new members in 2018. Currently we have one member who was hired for the Youth Firefighter position in 2017. He has completed Firefighter 1 Level and will complete his EMT programs in the spring of 2019. As he will become 18 in January, he will join the ranks as a firefighter.

In 2017, we designed a Youth Fire Fighter position for those individuals aged 16 and 17. This position was added to try to encourage young individuals to become involved in the Fire Service. The Youth Fire Fighter is able to respond to calls and participate with most of the duties, outside the danger zone, gain skills and knowledge that they can take with them.

The Fitzwilliam and Troy Fire Departments have joined forces in working together, with Automatic Aid for Fire Calls and training together throughout the year for both communities. This can give greater assurance to both communities that there will be coverage at all times.

REPORT OF THE FIREWARDS - continued

Monthly trainings were held for both our fire and EMS personnel continued throughout the year. Members also took part in refresher training for EMS courses. These are required every two years. EMS members are also required to have from 48 to 56 hours of continuing education every two years to recertify at their respective levels of EMS.

Members also participated in courses offered throughout the state that included Emergency Vehicle Driver Training, Incident Command, Large Animal Rescue, Ice Rescue and other Fire, Rescue and EMS courses. We also participated in regional training again this year with Richmond, Troy and Royalston, MA, culminating in a live training burn of an acquired structure in Richmond in October.

VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT

The other inventory of vehicles includes the 2003 Pierce Contender pumper, the 2009 Mack tanker, 2009 Ford 350 Super Duty forestry truck, 1994 International Pumper, and the 2013 Ford Ambulance. All the vehicles are in good working order at this time. All of the Fire Apparatus passed the annual pump testing in 2018.

All ground ladders were tested and passed their required tests. Also, all of the firehose was tested in 2018, however, we lost a considerable amount of hose due to the age of the hose. Some of the hose that was removed and placed out of service has been replaced with new hose. We will work in 2019 to replace the remainder of the hose within the submitted budget.

We had a Thermal Imager donated from an anonymous donor in December 2018. This was added to the first due engine for use at calls.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

Throughout the year work has taken place in several areas to evaluate the status of EMS calls and how to provide quality service. There was a committee formed, consisting of three individuals from the community, a member of the Board of Selectmen, the EMS Lt., a firefighter, the Board of Firewards and the Fire Chief. This committee met throughout the spring and summer evaluating the options and meeting with other services from southwestern NH. Following the meetings, the committee recommended to the Board of Firewards options to consider to assure that we are able to answer the needs of the community.

The recommendation that was accepted was to provide funding for a part-time Fire Chief and hire Per Diem EMS/FF staff to assure we can cover weekday calls from 7:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m., which represents 50% of the EMS calls for the department. The call members would then be covering the night time and weekend calls. At the time of this report, it appears to be supported by both the Board of Selectmen and the Budget Committee. If the budget is approved, this program would begin July 1, 2019.

2019 BUDGET

We have presented fire and ambulance budgets that we feel meet the needs of the town and the basic needs of the fire and EMS personnel. The Fire Department Budget is down \$3,138.00 from the budget approved at the 2018 Town Meeting.

There is also a request in the capital budget to place \$25,000.00 in the expendable trust fund for a replacement Class A pumper to be purchased in the future. There is also a request for monies to be placed in the Expendable Trust accounts for Machinery/Equipment-SCBA/Radios & Gear, as well as the Repair of Equipment and Apparatus.

REPORT OF THE FIREWARDS - continued

The ambulance operating budget for 2019 has been increased slightly under \$20,000. This would help to cover the proposed Per Diem staff changes to cover daytime calls. This increase is in the area of salaries and corresponding taxes, as well as medical supplies and equipment purchases. As this report is prepared, the Budget Committee and the Board of Selectmen are reviewing our proposals.

Both budgets reflect the salary for the part time Fire Chief, to begin in July 2019. This change will allow the Fire Chief to have time to complete all federal and state required paperwork as well as other items, such as inspections and community out-reach. The Fire Chief will also serve as one of the EMS providers during the weekdays to meet the state requirement of 2 licensed personnel on the ambulance for transport.

FOREST FIRE INFORMATION

The Forest Fire Warden and the five Deputy Wardens are responsible for issuing fire permits and investigating outside fires/complaints. These individuals work under the State of NH Division of Forests and Lands. This year there were over 350 fire permits issued in the town. These permits are for campfires, burning brush and any outside fire except charcoal grills. All permits for cooking and campfires are an annual permit and are good from the date of issue to December 31 of that year. Brush permits are only issued on the day of the burn are only good for the date issued. All open fires must be reported, prior to lighting the fire, to the dispatch center in Keene at 603-352-1291.

FUTURE NEEDS

The Fitzwilliam Fire Department, like most departments nationwide, is suffering in the decline of volunteer or call members. In 2008 we had 30 members and 269 calls, 2018 we have 21 members and had 407 calls. The department relies on Mutual Aid for many of our calls. In our area, we are very fortunate to have the Southwestern District Fire Mutual Aid System. Fitzwilliam was a charter member of this system, which was one of the first in the country. Under our mutual aid agreement, to receive mutual aid, a department must be able to provide it to other members/departments. Many communities, due to understaffing, rely on mutual aid to meet their regular call volume.

Although we rely on the benefits of our mutual aid system, the Fitzwilliam Fire Department is always looking for new members to become firefighters and/or EMS personnel. The Fitzwilliam Fire Department is a paid on-call department, if you can make the call you are paid for the time of the call. Please consider joining the department. Applications can be found on line on the Town of Fitzwilliam's website.

The Board of Firewards, officers and members of the fire department would like to thank the community for their continued support. Community members with questions about the fire department are encouraged to contact the Firewards and officers. Anyone is encouraged to visit the department and learn more about fire and EMS services in town.

2018 REPORT OF THE RECREATION DEPARTMENT

The Fitzwilliam Recreation Department offered varied programs in 2018.

Youth Basketball, offered this winter for 6 weeks of practices and games, included 40 area youth. In the fall, 108 kids participated in Youth Soccer. This program also ran for 6 weeks and included a clinic with the Franklin Pierce Soccer Program and a Homecoming Parade at Monadnock Area Senior Middle High School.

Programs for the youngest members of the community included both the Caregivers/Infant/Toddler Program and the Kids' Yoga. Both activities were held at the Fitzwilliam Town Library on alternating Friday mornings and were free to the public. The C//T Program is a playgroup for mothers/caregivers and their children. Once a month there is Nursery Rhyme Time when participants are led in songs, chants, and finger plays with the help from the Fitzwilliam Town Library. Preschoolers and toddlers were eligible for Kid's Yoga instructed by Robyn Anderson Hannett.

The Fitzwilliam Summer Recreation Program was run by new Director Kaitlyn Derry and a staff of 6 counselors. Days spent at Summer Rec included crafts, games, fishing, and water fun. The camp ventured on field trips to the Retreat Farm in Brattleboro, roller skating at Roll On America, bowling at Yankee Lanes, and swimming at Spofford Lake. They even joined the Troy Summer Recreation Program for a day of fun and adventures at the Samuel E. Paul Community Center.

Come spring, the Recreation Department collaborated with the Police, Fire, and Highway Departments, plus NH Fish and Game to hold the Annual Children's Fishing Derby. The event was held at the Village Pond on Saturday, May 26th. Prizes were awarded for various category winners.

Open Gym for Men's Basketball was offered once a week throughout the school year at Emerson School. Strong by Zumba, instructed by Sheena Royce, was offered at the Samuel E. Paul Community Center in Troy. As always, the tennis courts (located next to the school) are available for public use. This year, designated times and instruction for Pickleball games were added to the venue.

The Recreation Department offered a catapult craft to kids at the first Fitzwilliam Fantasy Faire held on October 6th. Just two weeks later, the Annual Spooktacular Fall Fest was held on October 20th. A Kid's Monster Dash was followed by games, music, treats, crafts, and ghost-making on the Common and Library lawn.

An Adult Craft Night was held Friday, November 2nd at the Fitzwilliam Depot. Attendees crafted a holiday stenciled wooden sign. The class was led by local artisan, Danielle Jacques.

The Recreation Department strives to offer affordable programming to the community. The Commission holds meetings the second Monday of each month (7:00 p.m. at the Fitzwilliam Town Hall). 2018 REPORT OF THE CEMETERY TRUSTEES

Work Force:

In 2018 we operated with two part time employees. The trustees have continued handling the administrative work and dealing with the funeral homes, vendors and families.

Recurring Work:

We had an above average amount of mowing this year due to more rain. Fall cleanup was not completely finished when the weather, temperatures and budget ended our work.

Flower Planters:

The Lions Club again assisted us by planting the annual flowers in the barrel planters at both cemeteries. This joint project has us purchasing the flowers and the Lions doing the actual planting. We greatly appreciate their help each year.

Equipment Issues:

We purchased a new Hustler zero turn mower using funds from our capital reserves. The old Hustler zero turn mower completed its eighth full year of use in the cemeteries and remains in routine use. Our other equipment is in good shape.

Trees and New Plantings:

We have identified several trees at Pine Grove that will need to be removed due to their deterioration and the danger they present to the cemetery and people. We also plan to accomplish tree trimming in the Village Cemetery. This work will need to be contracted out to specialists.

Cemetery personnel trimmed and shaped plantings on the lots at both cemeteries as usual. We also removed a number of dying and overgrown shrubs and plantings at the request of the owners.

Grass and Leveling:

We have continued to level and reseed some low and sunken areas of the Village Cemetery. Pine Grove received applications of lime overall and fertilizer in some areas. Some over seeding of grass areas was done in Pine Grove to improve appearance.

Projects:

Pine Grove Flagpole – The old plantings at the base of the flagpole were removed and new granite curbing was installed to establish an attractive edging to the area. New plantings were installed with the advice of the Lions Club helping to guide us.

Sunken Markers – We were able to raise a number of sunken markers and will continue these efforts in the future. Failure to continue this work would result in some flat markers eventually disappearing from view. We actually found several sunken flush markers that had disappeared.

Granite Curbing – We did not spend a lot of time on this project this year due to other work. We will return to this project next year due to the need to level a number of the curbing pieces that are affecting memorial stones.

Marble Stone Cleaning – Only minor cleaning was accomplished this year and we will return to this work in 2019. You can easily see the improved appearance of these stones that we worked on over the past two years. The Village Cemetery has a high number of marble stones that need attention and these can easily be identified by their dark black color caused by bacterial growth that is detrimental to the stone surface.

REPORT OF THE CEMETERY TRUSTEES - continued

Budget:

We submitted a budget request that was level funded compared to last year, except for the amount needed to cover projected COLA increases in the hourly rates. We did not submit any other funding requests via the warrant articles. There are a few long term projects that we will need to begin planning and evaluating funding for in the future.



2018 REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD

Planning Boards are established to provide for the orderly growth and development of the municipality. Planning Board regulatory duties include the review and approval of all subdivisions, boundary line adjustments, voluntary mergers and site plan review applications for commercial uses or multi-family residences. The Planning Board may recommend and take public input on amendments to the Zoning Ordinance. The Planning Board, in a process which involves input from the people of Fitzwilliam, is also responsible for preparing and amending the town Master Plan to guide the development of the municipality.

This year was a year of change and more change. Under long-time Chairman, Terry Silverman, the year began with ongoing work on completing a Solar Ordinance to put before the residents of Fitzwilliam at the annual Town Meeting. Two additional changes to the ordinances were completed, one to amend the Table of Industrial Uses and the other to amend the Table of Accessory Uses.

In the Board vote for Officers that takes place after Town Meeting, the Board elected Ross Tourigny, Chairman; Paul Haynes, Vice Chairman; and Robin Peard Blais, Secretary. When Mr. Tourigny received an offer on his house, he stepped down as Chairman and the Board elected Suzanne Gray to be Chairman. By year end, two new Alternates were added to the Membership, Karen Craig and Barbara Young.

From early February through December, there was considerable time spent on the Chinook Solar Project that was proposed by NextEra. This is a project first proposed as Ranger Solar and that has been taken over by NextEra, a Florida company. In April, NextEra made a public presentation of their proposal in Fitzwilliam. Since that time, the Planning Board has devoted time and effort into understanding the issues regarding large scale solar installations and the approval process that the State of New Hampshire has in place for solar installations over 30 Mega Watts which go through and are approved or denied by the New Hampshire Site Evaluation Committee (SEC).

The Planning Board had two cases this year, a Site Plan Review for a Change of Use in the General Industrial District which, from Preliminary Consultation to final Approval with Conditions, took several meetings to complete. The other case was a Boundary Adjustment which was approved. There were also Preliminary Consultations regarding changes of use that proved useful in determining whether formal applications for Site Plan Review were required in cases where changes were determined to not be significant enough to warrant Site Plan Review.

The Planning Board values input from Town residents and welcomes you to attend meetings; and encourages interested volunteers to serve on the Planning Board as members or alternates. The Planning Board meets on the first and the third Tuesdays of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Town Hall.

2018 REPORT OF THE ZONING BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

The Zoning Board of Adjustment hears appeals for relief from zoning ordinance requirements. The Board considers the unique circumstances of each case and decides to grant relief, if warranted, based on specific criteria. They consider the impact of the proposed action on the neighborhood and the land, and whether it is in harmony with the purpose and intent of the zoning ordinance. The Board can't change zoning ordinances but is empowered to grant appeals in accordance with State Statute and local law as specified in the Land Use Code.

The Board considers appeals for Variances, Special Exceptions and Equitable Waivers of Dimensional Requirements, Appeals of Administrative Decisions and Motions for re-hearings.

During 2018 the Board of Adjustment deliberated on eight cases:

18.01 - Granted a Variance to construct a shed and porch within a setback, approved with conditions.

18.02 - Granted a Variance to permit the removal and replacement of an existing dwelling with a structure that is less non-conforming, approved with conditions.

18.03 - An application for a Variance to allow a shed within a front setback was withdrawn.

18.04 - Granted a Variance to construct a deck within a shoreland setback, approved with condition that DES approve the "As-Built" plans.

18.05 - Granted an Administrative Appeal to allow construction of a porch within the Wetland Protection Overlay District, approved with conditions.

18.06 - Granted a Variance to permit a shed within a setback.

18.07 - Granted a Special Exception for a change of business use, approved with condition.

18.08 - Granted a Special Exception for a change of residential use to a two-family, approved with a condition.

The Zoning Board of Adjustment meets at 7:00 p.m. on the second Tuesday of the month at the Fitzwilliam Town Hall when they have an application before them. The Board invites and encourages all interested parties to attend hearings and meetings as noticed.

2018 REPORT OF THE HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION

The mission of the Historic District Commission is to preserve historic structures and places of historic and architectural value; preserve a district in the municipality that reflects elements of its cultural, social, economic, political and architectural history; conserve property values; foster civic beauty; and maintain the existing architecture of the district. The Commission reviews all exterior construction/renovation located within the Historic District of Fitzwilliam through an application process and public meetings. They are also responsible for amendments to and adoption of regulations in accordance with State statutes.

In 2018, the Historic District Commissioners met five times and used the design guidelines to review seven applications including: exterior modifications and repairs for residences; location of sheds, roof, siding and window replacements; and paint color. Members also considered the new library sign and the proposed work on the library walkway and possible new fencing.

Applications for all exterior changes within the Historic District come before the Commission for consideration and approval. The Commission meets on the second Thursday of each month at 4:00 p.m. in the Town Hall when there is a case before it. All meetings are open to the public and we encourage participation from all those interested.

2018 REPORT OF THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Conservation Commission notes with considerable sadness the passing of Katie Metzger early in 2018. Many know of Katie's leadership role on the Commission and her devoted support of conservation in Fitzwilliam. We thank her and miss her.

The Conservation Commission continues its mission to protect the natural resources of Fitzwilliam. We thank voters for approving last year's addition to the Conservation Land Fund, and appreciate your continuing support.

The Commission continues working with the Monadnock Conservancy, who completed purchase of a large wetland area abutting Sip Pond and the Rail Trail. The Commission assisted the Conservancy with the transaction costs of this project, and the Conservancy is currently developing plans to improve recreational access to the property.

Over the past year the Commission adopted the Katie Metzger Town Forest Management Plan, and received a draft of trail design plans from consultant Lew Shelley for this property. Over the next year the Commission will begin implementing components of these plans. We also continue to monitor, maintain, stock maps, and update markers along the Widow Gage Town Forest trails. Maps of town trails have been updated and are available in the town Land Use Office.

The Commission's installation and upkeep of a dog waste cleanup station on the Collins Pond Road/Templeton Turnpike section of the Rail Trail continues to be highly successful. We thank walkers for cleaning up after their dogs by using the station and helping to prevent contamination of nearby wetlands and water bodies.

With town support, the Commission sponsored installation of a lead fishing lure/sinker disposal box at the town transfer station (sinkers of 1 oz. or less and jigs of 1 inch or less are illegal in NH). The Commission also co-sponsored a highly successful free ice-fishing day at Sip Pond in January.

We continue to maintain representation on the Monadnock Advisory Committee, the Meadowood Property Task Force and membership in the NH Association of Conservation Commissions. Members have attended workshops on grant writing, open space, conservation commission operations, and conservation fund management. The Commission continues to monitor opportunities and encourage conservation of the many scenic, recreational and wildlife habitat features of Fitzwilliam.

The Commission thanks Rick Brackett, who has left the Commission after many years of valuable service. We will greatly miss his expertise and knowledge of town natural resources. We also thank Jeanne Sable for her many years as secretary to the Commission. The secretary's role has now been assumed by Laurie Hayward, the town's new Land Use Assistant.

We continue to advise groups, applicants, and agencies on conservation matters and meet regularly with the select board.

The Conservation Commission meets downstairs at the Town Hall every third Monday at 7:00 p.m. We invite you to join us as a guest or new member.

2018 REPORT OF THE CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICE

The Code Enforcement office enforces regulations of the Fitzwilliam Land Use Codes, issues permits for construction, and occupancy permits for new home occupation after completion of construction.

Upon receipt of a written complaint, the Code Enforcement Officer performs an investigation, ensures compliance of construction permits to applicable zoning requirements, dedicates Emergency 911 numbers; and reviews all construction permit applications and plans. This review ensures safety from fire, flood and establishes that all other public requirements are met. Once a permit has been granted, the Code Enforcement Officer visits the property prior to the start of construction to determine that all setback requirements have been met. In the absence of a Code Enforcement Officer, those duties are handled by the Board of Selectmen and staff in the Selectmen's Office.

If you should have any questions with regard to permitting for construction please contact the Selectmen's Office to obtain a copy of the Construction Permit regulations. Please remember that all construction, renovation, demolition and changes to buildings require a permit. We have seen an increase of construction being completed in town without first obtaining a construction permit approval. It is always best to check with our office prior to construction to determine if a permit is required. When applying for a permit, please remember to allow yourself enough time for the paperwork to be processed prior to the start date of construction.

In 2018, 56 construction permits were issued, with four issued for new single-family dwellings and three issued for demolition and rebuilding of new single-family dwellings. If you should have any questions with regard to building issues, please feel free to contact the Selectmen's Office at 585-7723.

2018 REPORT OF THE ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER

2018 was relatively a busy year for animal calls. There were 208 calls for assistance ranging from dog complaints to crowing roosters. There were also several calls for wild animals such as skunks, bats, foxes, woodchucks, raccoons and a bobcat.

This year there were calls for service for moose and deer vs. motor vehicle accidents as well as two dogs and four domestic cats killed by motor vehicle. It is important to either keep dogs tied, on a leash or under voice control at all times for everyone's safety and it is the law. There were seven dog attacks this year, all on the owners of the dogs.

Please remember that you should contact the Police Department for any animal complaints by calling 585-6565.

If you are missing or have found a dog or cat or have an animal problem, please call the Fitzwilliam Police Department and they will notify the Animal Control Officer. It is fine to put it on Facebook or other social media areas, but the sooner we are notified by direct contact the faster we can assist you. There are times that we may already have your animal in custody.

There were a large number of fines for unregistered dogs this year. Please register your dogs at the Town Clerk's Office in the Town Hall by April 1, 2019.

I would like to thank everyone in the community for their assistance and support this year.

The 2018 statistics were as follows:

- 208 Calls for Service;
- 2 dogs taken to the Humane Society in Swanzey;
- 1 cat taken to the Humane Society in Swanzey;
- 7 dog bite incidents; and
- 5 cases investigated for possible animal abuse.

2018 SOUTHWESTERN COMMUNITY SERVICES

Southwestern Community Services provides assistance to local communities and its citizens through its' LIHEP Fuel Assistance program, Housing Stabilization programs, the Monadnock Alcohol and Drug Awareness Coalition (MADAC), Senior & Workforce rental housing developments, Head Start education & childcare, WIC nutrition & health, the Electricity Assistance Program (EAP), DOE Weatherization programs, Employment and Day Services for developmentally disabled adults as well as several Workforce Development & Training programs.

In Fiscal Year 2018, SCS provided 430 units of service to the citizens of Fitzwilliam totaling \$192,154.11 in direct assistance. SCS is requesting 1% of the amount of direct support.

Southwestern Community Services requests support from each city and town in our two-county service area. SCS requests 1% of the amount of direct support that SCS invested into that community during the previous program year. This means that from year-to-year the amount of town funding requests will change.

2018 REPORT OF THE COMMUNITY VOLUNTEER TRANSPORTATION COMPANY

Overall, CVTC registered 3,831 rides and drove 102,582 miles for 306 individual riders from 29 out of 34 towns in the Monadnock region. Eighty-eight volunteer drivers donated 5,789 hours for a value of \$86,835. In 2018, we received funding from 18 towns.

2018 Fitzwilliam Statistics

79 ride requests were received from 5 Fitzwilliam residents;
2/79 rides did not take place because no driver selected the ride;
3,469 miles logged in for volunteer drivers;
210 hours of service donated for a value of \$3,150;
4 volunteer drivers live in Fitzwilliam; and
drivers from other towns help cover Fitzwilliam rides.

Funding from towns represents \$14,500 (8%) of this year's operating budget of \$189,609. Forty-nine percent of the budget is federal dollars. The remaining 51% is raised from individuals, businesses, foundations and municipalities.

2018 REPORT OF THE MONADNOCK ADVISORY COMMISSION

The Monadnock Advisory Commission was created by State Statute (RSA 227-D:4) and is charged to advise and guide the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources (formerly, the Department of Resource and Economic Development) on the managed lands on Monadnock, Gap and Little Monadnock Mountains. State law allows the Commission to accept tax deductible donations. MAC funds are a primary source for search and rescue supplies and equipment.

Members of the Commission include two representatives from each of the towns these mountains are part of, the Monadnock State Park Manager, the Director of the Division of Parks and Recreation, the Director of the Division of Forests and Lands, and the President of the SPNHF (Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forests). Other guests include Antioch University MERE (Monadnock Ecological Research and Education) Project, SPNHF Volunteer Manager, and Monadnock State Park Volunteer Coordinator.

The Commission met once in 2018. Regular meetings are scheduled for the Spring and Fall but the Spring meeting was cancelled due to health issues suffered by a primary party. These meetings include voting on any expenditures, hearing reports from the various agencies in attendance, reviewing and discussing recommendations, and new business.

Day use of the State Park facilities in 2018 was down from the previous two years, probably due to high rainfall and higher temperatures during what are usually peak usage times. Significant upgrades to the campgrounds and toilet building at the State Park Headquarters are underway in order to adequately serve and process the visitors to that site. At the meeting this year, discussion was devoted to how to best plan for and develop the most effective ways to address needs related to visitor processing, trail improvement and maintenance, and funding. Much work is done each year to maintain and improve the trails on the mountain, some by volunteer crews and some by hired professional crews. These improvements provide significant use and preservation benefits, but accomplish far less than the estimates of needed work. Capital budget requests continue to reflect these needs.

Much time and effort has been spent attempting to come to an understanding of what the effect would be of over-use of the mountain. NH Division of Parks and Recreation had scheduled a carrying capacity study for Mt. Washington and Mt. Monadnock, but that study has been delayed until a later date following other more urgent matters needing attention.

The members of the Monadnock Advisory Commission encourage input from the citizens of our towns regarding anything to do with the mountains we are charged to advise. Please contact your representatives listed below.

TOWN WARRANT 2018**

To the inhabitants of the Town of Fitzwilliam, in the County of Cheshire, in said State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs, you are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Fitzwilliam on Tuesday, the 13th of March next between eleven (11:00) o'clock in the forenoon and seven (7:00) o'clock in the afternoon to act on issues required to be voted on by ballot (Articles 1 through 5) and to meet at seven (7:00) in the afternoon to act on the business matters of the Town (Articles 6 through 19). The polls will be open on ballot issues not later than 11:00 a.m. and close not earlier than 7:00 p.m., or such later time as shall be authorized by a vote of the Town.

ARTICLE 1. To bring in your votes for the election of one Selectman for three years; one Moderator for two years; one Fireward for three years; one Budget Committee Member for three years; one Trustee of the Trust Funds for three years; one Trustees of the Library for three years; one Cemetery Trustee for three years; two Planning Board members for three years; one Commissioners of Plante Memorial Park for three years.

ARTICLE 2. Are you in favor of the adoption of the Solar Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board, to be included as Chapter 148 in the Code of the Town of Fitzwilliam, generally described as follows:

- Solar energy systems shall be categorized in three size classifications:
 - Small-Scale – refers to residential- and business-scale solar energy systems that generate up to 15 kilowatts of power
 - Community-Scale – refers to Town-owner or a community-member owner solar energy system where power is produced to offset community power needs and generates between 15 kilowatts and 1 megawatt of power. The intent is not for an industrial/utility system where the purpose is to sell power for profit but to benefit the Town and its residents.
 - Utility-Scale – refers to large arrays or farms whose purpose is to generate power to sell to the open market and generate over 1 megawatt of power. These facilities would be subject to the requirements of the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission.
- All proposed solar energy systems are required to submit an application for a Construction Permit
- All proposed ground-mounted systems shall submit an application for a Conditional Use Permit
- Regardless of the size or type of solar energy system, all applicants are required to properly label safety hazards and provide directions for operation on their solar equipment
- Community-Scale and Utility-Scale solar energy systems shall adhere to stricter standards for permitting, which includes, but is not limited to: site design and landscaping plans; lighting in accordance with the Dark Skies regulations under Article II of §137 of the Code of the Town of Fitzwilliam; noise abatement; burial of utility controls and

on-site light connections; utility notification; all such appurtenant structures shall be architecturally compatible with each other and aesthetically unobtrusive; provision of an operation and maintenance plan; and financial surety.

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to be added to the Fire Department Vehicle and Equipment Repairs Expendable Trust Fund for the purpose of Fire vehicle and equipment repairs created by Article #20 of the 2015 Annual Meeting or any action thereon. (Recommended by Budget Committee, Recommended by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000 to be added to the Highway Department Vehicle Expendable Trust Fund created by Article #22 of the 2017 Annual Town Meeting for the purposes of purchasing of highway department vehicles and equipment or take any action thereon. (Recommend by Budget Committee, Recommended by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to be added to the Transfer Station Equipment Purchase and Repair Expendable Trust Fund created by Article #24 of the 2017 Annual Town Meeting for the purposes of purchasing and repairs of Transfer Station equipment or take any action thereon. (Recommend by Budget Committee, Recommended by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$21,500 to the Police Vehicle and Equipment Expendable Trust Fund created by Article #17 of the 2018 Annual Town Meeting for the purpose of purchasing and equipping a police cruiser for the use of the Police Department or take any action thereon. (Recommended by Budget Committee, Recommended by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to be added to the Conservation Land Expendable Trust Fund created by Article #19 of the 2005 Annual Town Meeting or take any action thereon. (Recommended by Budget Committee, Recommended by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 16. To see if the town will vote to change to purpose of the existing Village Common Improvements Expendable Trust Fund created by Article #12 of the 2001 Town Meeting for the purpose of making improvements to the Village Common, to a Village Common and Plante Memorial Park Expendable Trust fund for the purpose of making improvements to the Village Common and Plante Memorial Park or take any action thereon. (2/3 majority vote required)

ARTICLE 17. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the existing Police Station Expendable Trust Fund created by Article #24 of the 2007 Annual Town Meeting for the purpose of designing, site preparation and construction of a Police Station or take any action thereon. Said funds, with accumulated interest to date of withdrawal, are to be transferred to the municipality's general fund, (2/3 majority vote required) (Recommended by Budget Committee, Recommended by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$42,957 to be added to the Town Buildings Maintenance and Repair Expendable Trust Fund. This sum comes from unassigned fund balance (this represents the funds from the dissolved Expendable Trust created by Article #24 of the 2007 Annual Meeting for the purpose of designing, site preparation and construction of a Police Station) (Recommended by Budget Committee, Recommended by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 19. To see if the town will vote to change the purpose of the existing Police Special Detail Revolving Fund created by Article#22 of the 2006 Town Meeting for the purpose of expenditure of police special details to include the expenditure of all costs related to Police Special Details, costs for the maintenance of police vehicles, purchase of police vehicles and for police special detail duty related equipment or take any action thereon or take any action thereon. (2/3 majority vote required)

ARTICLE 20. To see if the town will vote to change the fire department organization per RSA 154:1 from organization under RSA 154:1 (d) with Firewards elected pursuant to RSA 669:17, with the fire chief appointed by the firewards and firefighters appointed by the fire chief to an organization under RSA 154:1 (a) a fire chief appointed by the local governing body, with firefighters appointed by the fire chief.

ARTICLE 21. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to convey an easement to Eric & Violet Stanway over a portion of land owned by the Town situated at the Depot Common for the purposes of installing and maintaining a septic system leach field in accordance with a plan prepared by Carl Hagstrom file #SD18061, provided said system is fully approved by the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services and to further authorize the Board of Selectmen to provide for such terms and conditions in granting of said easement as will preserve and protect the Depot Common property in the best interest of the town.

ARTICLE 22. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to reclassify 1,000 feet of Upper Gap Mountain Road (a.k.a. Gap Mountain Road) from Class VI Highway to Class V Highway, pursuant to RSA

231:22-a, beginning at the point southerly of the Troy/Fitzwilliam line where Upper Gap Mountain Road currently changes from Class V classification to Class VI classification and continuing 1,000 feet southerly/southeasterly.
