How to prepare it

Metals	ALUMINUM beverage cans	Rinse only
	Light ALUMINUM PIE PLATES, FOIL, AND FOOD TRAYS, etc.	Rinse only; may be flattened
	All metal, human and pet FOOD CANS and lids	Rinse only
	Scrap metal and appliances	According to attendant's instructions. Remove doors, metal shelves, and drawers from refrigerator - place in metal pile.
Glass	All whole GLASS BOTTLES and JARS	
Paper	All NEWSPAPER and circulars that come with newspaper	Bag, box or bundle, keep dry.
	Double-walled CARDBOARD boxes	Open out and flatten, keep dry.
	Slick colored MAGAZINES and catalogs	Bag, box or bundle separately.
	BROWN PAPER BAGS	Keep clean and dry.
Plastics	All clean, dry MIXED PAPER, including office paper, cereal and cake mix boxes, junk mail, paperback books	Bag, box or bundle, keep dry.
	PLASTIC CONTAINERS including all soda and liquor bottles, milk, cider and vinegar jugs, detergent, motor oil and bleach bottles, mayonnaise, peanut butter and other screw top plastic jars	Rinse, remove tops. Flatten only milk and cider jugs.
Textiles	Clean CLOTHING and textiles	Bagged or loose (Special bags are available through attendant.)
	Used MOTOR OIL and ANTIFREEZE	Do not mix with other fluids.
Misc.	CAR BATTERIES	—

Anything NOT on the above list may be disposed of in the compactor across the drive-way from our Recycling Center EXCEPT the following:

1. Tires (pay attendant; place on tire pile).
2. Furniture, TVs, and items too big to fit in compactor - ask attendant for instructions.
3. Wood, brush and yard waste - ask attendant for instructions and place in burn pit.

Recycling window #6	Sold to produce revenue for town.	Should not stick to a magnet
Recycling window #6	Sold to produce revenue for town.	Does not include anything too heavy to bend or that sticks to magnet.
Marked plastic barrels next to compactor	Sold to produce revenue for town.	Does not include non-food containers.
Metal pile, lower tier. Ask attendant for instructions. Be prepared to pay \$8 for refrigerators, \$5 for most other large appliances.	Reduces disposal costs. Fees cover extra handling charges.	Does not include anything that is made of mostly plastic or other non-metal materials.

Ask attendant for instructions.	Made available for re-use.	—
Recycling window #2	Sold to produce revenue for town.	Remove only very shiny ads like coupons.
Recycling window #7	Sold to produce revenue for town.	No lightweight cereal, shoe, gift boxes, etc.
Recycling window #3	Sold to produce revenue for town.	No books.
Use to bag other recyclables or save in marked box after emptying non-recyclables into compactor.	Sold to produce revenue for town.	No white, colored or plastic bags.
Recycling window #4	Is given away to reduce disposal costs.	No waxed milk, juice or ice cream cartons. No plastic windows in toy boxes. No hard covers on books.
Recycling window #5	Sold to generate revenue for town.	Does not include any container without a neck or screw top - such as cottage cheese or yogurt containers. Also, no plastic bags or miscellaneous items such as hangers or ice cube trays.
Marked box in trailer past recycling building	—	Does not include soiled or wet items.
Pour into marked containers in yellow shed	Made available for re-use.	Includes only fluids labeled on barrels.
Platform beside driveway on right	Made available for re-use.	No small batteries.

4. Paints and fluids such as chemicals - ask attendant for instructions. Many items not acceptable.
5. Quality reusable items - in working or easy to repair condition - place on free exchange table past recycling building.
6. Building and construction debris - check with attendant.
